



## PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND NOMINEE PROGRAM PROOF OF LANGUAGE ABILITY FORM

Moderate language ability is a requirement of the PEINP and you must submit proof you meet the moderate level in all four categories. We use the Canadian Language Benchmarks as the guide when judging an applicants language ability. In order to prove your language ability, you the applicant, may complete this form or supply the results of a language test. Language tests must be taken through an approved organization and must not be more than two years old.

The proof of language information you submit will be confirmed at interview.

Overall definition of moderate language ability: You can communicate comfortably in familiar social and work situations.

Speaking: You can communicate with some confidence on familiar topics, can communicate facts and ideas in some detail, and demonstrate a range of everyday vocabulary.
