## Federal-Provincial Working Groups on Temporary Foreign Workers in Alberta and British Columbia

In an attempt to meet urgent and ongoing labour market needs in Alberta and British Columbia, bilateral working groups have been formed to develop collaborative approaches to managing Federal and Provincial initiatives aimed at facilitating the entry of temporary foreign workers.

The Working Groups identify priorities and new approaches by sharing information. They identify skill shortages and develop strategies to facilitate processing applications from employers. They work to meet employer needs through education and promotion and periodic evaluation of the effectiveness of strategies.

The work of these groups which also includes pilot projects serves as best practices which could be of use to other regions. Membership in these groups includes various representatives from the federal and provincial departments.
