BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Joint Planning and Policy Development Forum Process

The Joint Planning and Policy Development Forum process, established in 1999, is a gathering bringing together First Nations and Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) representatives in an open dialogue forum to discuss, listen and learn about First Nation goals and aspirations and make recommendations for departmental changes in planning, programs and service delivery in order to improve the quality of life in First Nation communities. The goal is to better reflect First Nations realities in INAC BC Region directions and activities

There have been seven joint forums since 1999. BC Region is committed to integrating First Nations' priorities identified through joint dialogue forums and joint committees into regional and operational decision-making processes.

Issues pertaining to national policy, program funding allocations and priorities, or requiring legislative amendments are currently outside of the purview of the Forum process. Issues of this nature can be communicated by the Steering Committee (SC) to national organizations for consideration.

The Joint Planning and Policy Development Forum Steering Committee

A joint Steering Committee composed of departmental staff and First Nations forum participant volunteers was struck in 1999. Following the 2001 Forum, the Steering Committee committed to overseeing the process of flowing Forum recommendations to appropriate Joint First Nation/DIAND committees in B.C.

The relationship of the Joint Forum Steering Committee to that of the Joint First Nation/DIAND committees is one of *facilitator**. The Steering Committee has no mandate to direct the work of the joint committees, however, the joint committees have expressed a strong desire to work with the Steering Committee and each other to better coordinate their activities and address the recommendations arising from the Forums.

Directory of Joint Committees

The attached list of joint First Nations/ INAC committees was compiled for your reference and to facilitate more direct First Nations participation in the development of DIAND policies affecting their communities.

These committees have technical expertise in areas such as social and economic development, education and capital.

The majority of the joint committees have existed for years and have undertaken their work independently from the relatively new Joint Planning and Policy Development Forum process. Other committees, such as the First Nation Public Service Committee were established as a direct result of Forum recommendations.

Policy or Funding Allocation Committees

Various committees focus on policy development, while others focus on funding review and allocation under various DIAND programs and initiatives. Funding allocation committees are largely proposal driven.

First Nations Participation

You are encouraged to forward comments/ recommendations respecting departmental policies, procedures or programs directly to the appropriate committee. These joint committees and the Joint Planning and Policy Development Forums represent two ways in which First Nation communities can participate in the development of departmental policies and procedures which affect their lives. We encourage you to take advantage of these avenues to ensure your views are heard.

Signatories to the MOU are Fisheries and Oceans, Indian and Northern Affairs Canada, Environment Canada, Human Resource Development Canada, BC Aboriginal Fisheries Commission, First Nations Summit Task Force and Native Brotherhood of BC.

Forums and Working Groups

The Federal Government agencies and First Nations organizations agree to establish a process to facilitate their dialogue. Topics for discussion will be determined in forums and working groups. The work of these forums and working groups will be enabled by the Steering Committee described above.
