Additional statistics:

There were 134 Referrals which may include: Referred for compliance promotion; Referred to other federal government departments, to provincial/territorial/municipal government departments, to foreign governments and to other agencies.

Out of the 88 investigations * started in FY 2002/2003, 22 ended in FY 2002/2003 and 66 are still on-going. In addition, there were 68 investigations which started before FY 2002/2003: 50 were completed in FY 2002-2003 and 18 are still on-going.

Explanatory notes:

The statistics are tabulated as follows:

The number of inspections relates to the number of regulatees inspected for compliance under each of the applicable regulations.

* Investigations are tabulated by number of investigations files. An investigation file may include activities relating to more that one legislation and furthermore relating to more than one regulation.

Therefore, the total number of investigations shown by regulation do not add to the total at the legislation level.

All measures (except for prosecutions) are tabulated at the section level of a regulation. Example, if the outcome of an inspection is the issuance of a written warning which relates to 3 sections of a given regulation the number of written warnings is 3.

The number of prosecutions is represented by the number of regulatees that were prosecuted regardless of the number of regulations involved.
