There were no Environmental Protection Compliance Orders (EPCOs). There were no Environmental Protection Alternative Measures (EPAMs).

There were 146 Referrals which may include: Referred for compliance promotion; Referred to other federal government departments, to provincial/territorial/municipal government departments, to foreign governments and to other agencies.

Out of the 51 investigations * started in FY 2003/2004, 14 ended in FY 2003/2004 and 37 are still on-going. In addition, there were 139 investigations which started before FY 2003/2004: 57 were completed in FY 2003/2004 and 82 are still on-going.

The number of inspections relates to the number of regulatees inspected for compliance under each of the applicable regulations.

* Investigations are tabulated by number of investigations files. An investigation file may include activities relating also to another legislation and include one or more regulations. Therefore, the total number of investigations shown by regulation do not add to the total at the legislation level.

All measures (except for prosecutions) are tabulated at the section level of a regulation. Example, if the outcome of an inspection is the issuance of a written warning which relates to 3 sections of a given regulation the number of written warnings is 3.

The number of prosecutions is represented by the number of regulatees that were prosecuted regardless of the number of regulations involved.
