The Seniors Housing Program

Many seniors find their housing needs change over time. Some find their income is less than in earlier years making housing difficult to afford. Others may find it increasingly difficult to maintain their own home. In recognition of these needs, the federal and provincial governments provide funding for the construction and maintenance of Seniors Housing units.

Where Are Seniors Housing Units Located?

Seniors Housing units are located in 38 Island communities.

Who Is Eligible?

Any person who is at least sixty years old may be eligible for Seniors Housing.

How Are Tenants Selected?

Tenants are selected based on need. A rating system is used to determine which applicants have the greatest needs. When assessing need, consideration is given to a person's income, assets, health, present accommodation, age, and length of time the application has been on file.

What Facilities Do The Units Offer?

Most housing units are one bedroom apartments with a living room, kitchen, bathroom and storage area. A few buildings have bachelor style apartments which are similar to one bedroom style apartments but they do not have a separate bedroom.

Some buildings have units specifically designed for tenants with a disability.

Each unit is provided with a refrigerator and stove. Heat and ongoing maintenance of the unit are included in the rent.

Each tenant is responsible for furniture and drapes, as well as the cost of electricity, telephone, cable TV, and tenant's insurance. New tenants must make their own arrangements with the electric utility to have the power to their unit turned on.

What Rent Is Charged?

Rent charged on a unit varies based on the income of the tenant involved. The rental charge is currently set at 30% of income.

How Do I Apply?

To apply for Seniors Housing please complete the attached registration form and return it to the Regional Housing Office nearest you. The addresses are listed on the back of this brochure.

Once you have indicated an interest in Seniors Housing, a housing representative will schedule an interview with you.
