HEALTH INFORMATION

I, the undersigned, being an official veterinarian of Canada do hereby certify that:

1. Canada has been free from foot-and-mouth disease for the two (2) years immediately prior to export and no vaccination against foot-and-mouth disease is allowed in Canada.
2. Canada has been free of rinderpest, bluetongue, contagious caprine pleuro-pneumonia, *peste des petits ruminants*, epizootic haemorrhagic disease, sheep pox, goat pox, Rift Valley fever, vesicular stomatitis for twelve (12) months immediately prior to export and during this time vaccination against any of these diseases has not been carried out.
3. Canada is free of brucellosis and exported animals were have been subjected with negative results to a serological test (BPAT) for brucellosis prior to shipment.
4. The herd of origin of these animals has been free of scrapie for the preceding three (3) years; Scrapie is a mandatory notifiable disease in Canada.
5. Exported animals are marked in such a way that they can readily be traced to their holding(s) of origin.
6. The exported animals have remained continuously on the territory of Canada for at least three (3) months prior to the day of loading.
7. The exported animals are not animals to be destroyed under a scheme to eradicate a contagious or infectious disease.
8. The exported animals do not come from a holding which is the subject of a prohibition on animal health grounds and have not been in contact with animals from such a holding.
9. The exported animals were not fed with ruminant proteins according to Canadian Regulation.
10. The exported animals have been inspected today and showed no clinical signs of disease.
11. Any transport vehicles or containers in which they were loaded were previously cleansed and disinfected with an officially authorized disinfectant and so constructed that faeces, urine, litter or fodder could not flow or fall out of the vehicle during transportation.
