

**VETERINARY HEALTH CERTIFICATE****EXPORT OF FRESH OR FROZEN CANINE SEMEN TO SWEDEN****PART A - VETERINARY SURGEON'S CERTIFICATE**

I, _____ (BLOCK LETTERS), being a licensed registered veterinary surgeon in the province of _____, Canada, hereby certify in respect of the semen being exported that:

1. I examined the donor dog described as follows:

on _____, being the date of collection of the semen for export, and found him to be healthy, free from evidence of venereally transmissible diseases and no evidence existed indicating that the donor was infected with or the carrier of any contagious diseases.

2. After due enquiry, I am satisfied that during the past six (6) months the dog has not been on any premises on which rabies has been diagnosed in the previous twelve (12) months.
3. The donor dog has been vaccinated against rabies using an approved/licensed vaccine not less than thirty (30) days and not more than twelve (12) months prior to collection of the semen for export.
4. I collected the semen for export and confirm that this consignment of semen was collected from the dog identified above.
5. I placed the semen, after collection, in a container for storage and transport which bears the name, breed and registration number (if applicable) of the donor dog.
6. **Testing and Treatment**
- *i) In the case of fresh semen:
- a) the donor dog was, within fifteen (15) days prior to export of the semen, subjected to a serum agglutination test for *Brucella canis* with a negative result (negative is less than 50% agglutination at a serum dilution of 1:100);
- b) the donor dog was, within fifteen (15) days prior to export of the semen, subjected to a micro-agglutination lysis test for Leptospirosis (*Leptospira interrogans* serovars icterohaemorrhagiae and canicola) with a negative result (negative is less than 50% agglutination at a serum dilution of 1:100).
