STUDY QUESTION:

What words do you know that you could use to

talk about farm animals in the spring time?

THE ACTIVITY:

Exploring vocabulary and language use on the theme of agriculture during the spring season.

CURRICULUM FIT:

Developing vocabulary

AGRICULTURE CONCEPTS: Farming: farm animals

PURPOSE: To learn vocabulary related to farm animals in

spring.

To further develop language skills while learning

about farm animals during the spring season.

MATERIALS REQUIRED: Film about spring and animals in spring, or pic-

ture books on farm animals and their young.

TIME REQUIRED: 1 class period.










BACKGROUND -- For the Teacher

Students are introduced to the names of agricultural animals and their young. Discussion also helps students display growth in thought processes by orally expressing simple descriptions and comparisons between the young and the adult of each farm animal species.



PROCEDURE

Part 1

Introduction

- 1. Show class a film or film strip about animals in spring to introduce vocabulary. If one is unavailable, there are many picture books that may be used instead: eg.
 - A. "Baby Farm Animals", National Geographic Society.
 - B. "<u>Understanding Farm Animals</u>", Ruth Thomson.
 - C. "<u>Baby Animals on The Farm</u>", Hans-Heinrich Isenbart Ruth Rau.
 - D. "Born in a Barn", Elizabeth and Klaus Gemming.
 - E. "All Color World of Farm Animals", Robert Burton.

Part 2

Activity

- 2. Students brainstorm names of animals on a farm while theteacher lists them on the board. Beside each, list the names of corresponding baby animals. Students may refer to this list when completing the student resource sheet.
- 3. Students complete unscrambling "Baby Farm Animals." (Student Resource Sheet included.)

Part 3

Conclusion

4. Students choose a favorite baby farm animal and draw and color a picture of it.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Ask children what their favorite baby animal is. Have children describe visits they have had to the farm where they have seen baby animals.

EVALUATION

1. Completed student resource sheets.
