I, the undersigned official veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that:

- 1. The semen originates from birds which were born and reared in Canada or had been continuously resident in Canada for the ninety (90) days preceding collection.
- 2. The donor birds were inspected by a qualified poultry inspector or licensed veterinarian at the time of collection of the semen and were found to be free of evidence of infectious or contagious disease.

- 3. The flock from which the shipment originates has been subject to regular inspection by an official inspector of the Canadian Food Inspection Agency free of evidence of infectious or contagious diseases, and, so far as can be determined, has not been exposed to such diseases.
- 4. The flock of origin has been confirmed to be free from Newcastle disease (velogenic and mesogenic), mycoplasma (M. gallisepticum, M. synoviae and M. meleagridis), Salmonella pullorum, Salmonella gallinarum and intestinal salmonella (S. typhimurium and S. arizona) as a result of sampling performed under a recognized flock monitoring program.
- 5. Sanitary precautions were observed during the collection and handling of the semen to prevent contamination by pathogenic micro-organisms.
- 6. The donor birds have not been subjected to any prophylactic vaccination against infectious poultry diseases using live or modified virus vaccines during the fourteen (14) days immediately preceding collection of the semen.
- 7. The semen was examined immediately following collection and was found to be of acceptable quality for processing and shipment.
- 8. The semen was extended in a diluent to which antibiotics in generally accepted levels have been added and, to the knowledge of the certifying veterinarian, the semen is free from contamination by pathogenic microorganisms.
