A. Health Conditions

I, the undersigned Veterinary Officer, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, hereby certify that:

1. Canada is officially free of foot-and-mouth disease, African swine fever, hog cholera, vesicular stomatitis, swine vesicular disease, Teschen disease, Aujeszky's disease and swine brucellosis;
2. the pigs identified in Section C come from a farm where there have been no outbreaks of the following diseases for the last six (6) months and individual animals are free from clinical evidence of such diseases: leptospirosis, porcine parvovirus, swine influenza, erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, transmissible gastroenteritis (TGE) and swine (vibriotic) dysentery;
3. the animals originate from premises where tuberculosis has not been diagnosed for the last twelve (12) months;
4. the animals were isolated from any additions to the herd of origin for at least thirty (30) days prior to import;
5. the animals were treated twice for leptospirosis at a fourteen (14) day interval with dihydrostreptomycin at a rate of 25 mg/kg body weight, or another antibiotic recognized to be effective against leptospirosis. The second injection shall be on the day of shipment;

6. in cases where animals are vaccinated for porcine parvovirus, an inactivated (killed) vaccine was used;

7. within twenty-four (24) hours before departure, animals were carefully examined by a veterinarian, at the port of embarkation, and found free of communicable diseases and exposure thereto, and were also free of physical defects and deformities likely to affect their breeding potential;
8. the animals were not fed garbage at any time;
9. no animals or other ruminants were aboard the ship or aircraft from another country during the time when the pigs are on board the ship or aircraft;

B. Testing Requirements

Within thirty (30) days prior to export, the animals were tested and found negative for the following diseases:

1. Brucellosis: Buffered plate agglutination test. Suspicious animals were confirmed negative by the ELISA test.
2. Tuberculosis: Intradermal test using the bovine PPD tuberculin.
3. Transmissible gastroenteritis: Serum neutralization test at 1:8 dilution. In case of positive neutralization tests, TGE should be ruled out with the ELISA test
