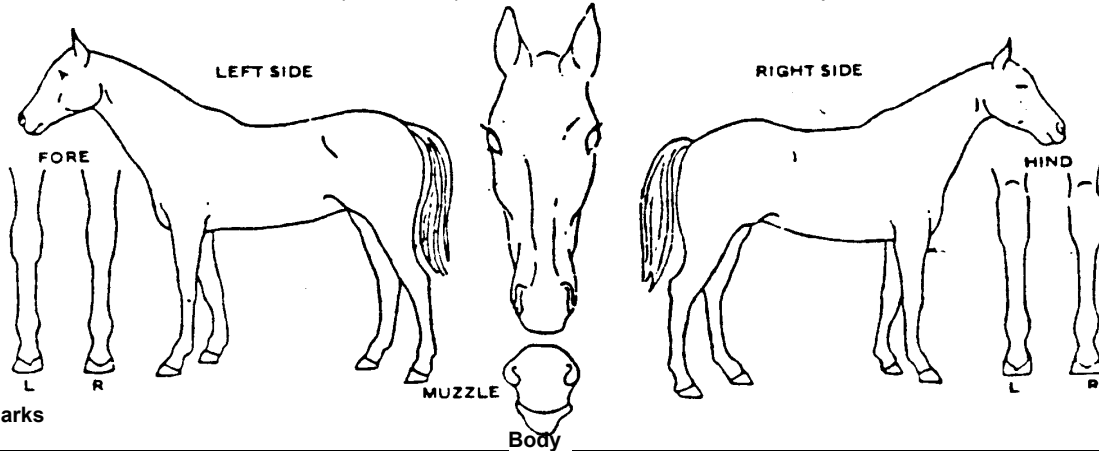

I hereby certify, in respect of the animal described above, that after due enquiry and to the best of my knowledge and belief:

- The animal has been in Canada and/or the U.S.A. during the sixty (60) days preceding exportation.
- The animal was inspected on the premises of origin and found free from evidence of communicable disease and, insofar as can be determined, has not been exposed to communicable disease during the sixty (60) days preceding exportation.

- The animal has not been vaccinated with a live or attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the fourteen (14) days preceding exportation.
- Insofar as can be determined, no case of African horse sickness, dourine, glanders, surra, epizootic lymphangitis, ulcerative lymphangitis, equine piroplasmiasis, or Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis has occurred on the premises of origin or on adjoining premises during the sixty (60) days preceding exportation.
- The animal was submitted to the immunodiffusion test (coggins) or ELISA for equine infectious anaemia during the one hundred eighty (180) days preceding exportation in a laboratory approved by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.
