Assignment #6- Roll-up

This assignment dealt with "The Look and Feel of the Youth Health section", on the Canada Health Portal. The Canada Health Portal (http://chp-pcs.gc.ca) team had been busy designing a new look for their youth health section. The Canadian Youth Connection was asked what they thought of the new look? The online youth team was asked have a look at the following two images and give their comments. JPG1 is what the youth section currently looks like and JPG2 is the proposed new look.

JPG1

- 1. What do you like about this image?
- 2. What do you not like about this image?
 - Don't like the image-very generic...
 - 1. LIKES

First of all, I like the overall design of the website, especially the stethoscope on the bottom of the sidebar menu. I like the words "Targeting Health" because it sends the message that Health IS important and Health Canada is doing something about it.

2. DISLIKES

Okay, first off...what are the ELDERLY pictures doing on a YOUTH health website? This would be in no way appealing to a youth who doesn't necessarily read the words first before deciding if a website will be useful. What impression will this leave on youth? Will this influence them to stay on the page? This page also looks like an "oldie" website, with the same old text font that all government websites basically have. As well....where is the word YOUTH on this page?

Bad use of white space to separate site listings.

"Source: Health Canada" ITALICS?? ewww... italics should be banned from all websites. (Some monitors doesn't display them properly and they hurt my eyes) It has 2 different breadcrumb menus displaying different hierarchy, great way to confuse people.

- 1. What do you like about this image?
 Very clear headings, it seems as if the information is well organized and easy to find.
 - 2. What do you not like about this image? Lack of colour and attention grabbing pictures which make the overall look boring and quite dull.

 The image is well-organized and I like that it has a button for adjusting text size (which means that it doesn't assume that everyone knows that you can adjust text size on your browser yourself).

2. DISLIKES

I dislike the fact that the sidebar menu is the SAME for YOUTH, but if this was the intended purpose for Health Canada in order to keep information in check and clearly seen, then it is appropriate.

The color scheme is okay. It's not dull nor is it non-eye catching. The colors "don't clash" so to speak, so I don't think there is anything wrong here. The new text font of the NEW page doesn't deviate from the colors and actually adds a little something.

4. We have deliberately tried to keep the "look" and colours (the blue and orange colour scheme) of this proposed youth health look in line with the rest of the Canada Health Portal (http://chp-pcs.gc.ca). Was this a good idea? Why or why not? No.

The colours you chose to keep are not the best combination I could think of. The blue is a good Colour but not the orange. I think you should have spiced up the image a bit. I wouldn't change everything, but maybe step up the graphics.

 - 2. What do you not like about this image?

Maybe this is just me, but the content in the pages looks absolutely identical to what seems to be the adult section in the last image, perhaps that that was the youth section. Perhaps the content should focus specifically for youth. I'm not saying that the content isn't appropriate on the page; I just think there should be a difference in the content between the youth and adult pages. If all the same content is in the adult section, why have the youth? As for style I think that it is quite nice.

3. Are the photographs in jpg2 good choices for a youth health section and if not, what are we missing?

I think that the images are fitting; there are people of different races, shapes, sizes, and ages (I think). It is not gender biased so, for the most part I think it is good.

4. We have deliberately tried to keep the "look" and colours (the blue and orange colour scheme) of this proposed youth health look in line with the rest of the Canada Health Portal (http://chp-pcs.gc.ca). Was this a good idea? Why or why not?

I think that this is a good idea, it keeps a flow to the Canada Health Portal. They look like they belong together, as opposed to being completely different. I like the idea that the changes were made subtly instead of with colours.

• 1. I like this image because it looks futuristic and keeps up with the times. This is important because you are trying to appeal to teens. I also like the different faces because it shows diversity and gives a good multimedia alternative. The bright colours (blue and orange) are very attractive and look very nice together. The information on this site also has better titles, which draws you in to click on one of the topics.

What is that ugly font?? and why is it so tiny?...

The underlines on links are too close to the text. It's totally ugly. (move it down)

The: before the orange menu links are totally unnecessary and weird looking.

Menu links aren't bolded. Not sure if that's a good idea.

There is a big white space on the right, below the logo and the content of the page only uses 70% of the space available. This makes the paragraphs really long and that is a big no. (leave less space at least use 80% to 90%)

3) photographs

You are missing my picture... j/k.

The photos are excellent.

However the text "Access to Authoritative and Trusted Information and Services" is too light. I cannot read it at all.

- 4) As mentioned in the general comments, the youth section should definitely be consistent with the rest of the site. You can change the header, but not the menus and the rest. (changing the header is good) I find that the youth section is closely connected with the rest of the site, and therefore having a different design is confusing.
- 1. What do you like about this image?
 Better use of pictures and colour make the page seem livelier.
 - 2. What do you not like about this image?

The picture of the girl with dyed purple hair seems to portray a stereotype of youth which I personally dislike because not everyone dyes their hair, has piercing, etc. in their youth.

- 3. Are the photographs in jpg2 good choices for a youth health section and if not, what are we missing? I think the photographs portray quite well Canada's multiculturalism, however I dint think they are very health orientated. Maybe some photographs illustrating specific health issues would be more appropriate.
- 4. We have deliberately tried to keep the "look" and colours (the blue and orange colour scheme) of this proposed youth health look in line with the rest of the Canada Health Portal (http://chp-pcs.gc.ca). Was this a good idea? Why or why not?

Yes, I think it's a good idea to keep the same colours to show that all the sites are related to one another. However, I think that even if the colours would be changed for something more interacting or attention grabbing, the meaning and message of the site would not be lost.

- 1. What do you like about this image?

 I like the way the sections of text have been broken up by lines of blue. The menu draws attention to itself. The photos of people on the page are relevant to youth, since they portray members of that age group. I also like that the entire page (when browser is maximized) fits on the screen and scrolling is not needed.
 - 2. What do you not like about this image? I think that the subtitle "Access to Authoritative and Trusted Information and Services" should be made darker. It doesn't contrast well with the shade of blue behind it. The links at the top of the page (Alcohol and Alcoholism, illegal drugs, gambling and tobacco and smoking) are good, but it might be good to have quick links as well to sexual health and dietary health (anorexia, bulimia, bulking up, etc) since those are big concerns for youth.
 - 3. Are the photographs in jpg2 good choices for a youth health section and if not, what are we missing?

The photos are alright. My only two concerns, since I assume that the goal is to have a balanced looking distribution of population, would be to include another male/replace a female (right now there are 5 females, 2 males) and one person of First Nations ancestry.

4. We have deliberately tried to keep the "look" and colours (the blue and orange colour scheme) of this proposed youth health look in line with the rest of the Canada Health Portal (http://chp-pcs.gc.ca). Was this a good idea? Why or why not?

I think this is a good idea. There should be consistency when browsing

sites or it will just lead to confusion.

2) Now this is really confusing. You have the same names for sub-categories for youth section as the adult or whatever sub-categories. If after I've looked at the "addictions" category within the regular portal and then I got in the Youth section, I would assume that the Additions in here is the same as the one I've check out earlier. These are topics relative to the general population, including youth (i.e. they are not youth-specific and any link in those areas can be relevant to youth), so why have a separate youth section? The greenish coloured links looks odd.

• 1. What do you like about this image?

The headlines and subtopics are very clear and well organized. It seems really easy to find the information that one is looking for.

2. What do you not like about this image?

The colour scheme works fine except for the grey used at the left of the page towards the bottom half. I really dint like the way the grey colour looks in combination with the other ones.

- 1. What do you like about this image? I really like the menu setup on this jpg. It's far more specific and looks much easier to use. The sidebar with current advisories is excellent because it makes the site feel current and trustworthy (no outdated information).
 - 2. What do you not like about this image? I'm not a huge fan of the grey on the advisory box. It seems disjointed with the rest of the page theme. Perhaps using the dark blue and black found on the top bar of the site would make it fit in better.
