

## CYC Activity 34: Resume Builder and Template

The Resume Builder is an online tool available through the Government of Canada's JobBank Web site. It allows jobseekers to create and save up to 5 professional resumes online. The Resume Builder provides step by step resume writing tips and sample resumes to help you get your resume just right.

At the time Activity 34 was launched, the Resume Builder was still part of another Web site, JobsEtc. The developers of the Resume Builder were preparing for the integration of the JobEtc. site with JobBank. As part of this process, they were considering which elements of the Resume Builder tool could be transferred to JobBank. A second option under consideration was the creation of a similar, more stream-lined resume building product to be hosted on youth.gc.ca.

To help the Resume Builder folks weigh all their options, Activity 34 featured a survey in which members were asked to identify which elements of the Resume Builder they thought were the most helpful and would most like to see included in a scaled down version of this tool. They were also asked to take a look at a resume template that was being considered as a possible replacement and offer their comments. Due to the fact that the information was needed quickly, this activity was only available on the forum for one week. Perhaps as a result of this, only 11 members responded. However, those who did participate offered insightful responses and helpful information.

#### Responses

I think this template would be more useful for people not familiar with resume writing, such as students or those who have not applied for jobs before. The format is helpful, but most word processing programs (Microsoft Word, WordPerfect) have multiple versions of resume templates in different styles included.

**Question 6c): What could be added to this template to make it more useful?**

**Responses**

More tips. Maybe you could hyperlink the title of each section and when you click on it you would be brought to a page containing tips and suggestions for that section of the resume.

Better layout and different sections. Not everyone wants an objective right at the top, or even a qualifications section.. maybe the qualifications could be shown in the relevant skills. I think this template is way too generic.

The option for different styles of resume would be useful. Many people who do not have a lot of work experience may be put off by the current format, as it lists multiple spaces for jobs.

There should be another information sheet explaining each section and what to put in it. Sometimes people are exposed to more than one style of resume template and therefore do not know specifically what to put under each section. Since this resume only has one section for job experience, does that mean I can put my volunteer work there and my extracurricular activities I do after work? Another improvement is to add more sections, such as putting job experience as one title, Hobbies and Interest as another and Other Relevant Skills for volunteer work and outside work environment activities. I realized that under the job experience section, it does not tell you whether to put experience in chronological order from top to bottom or vice versa. If a person who builds his/her first resume based on this template, she/he may be unsure how to organize her job experiences. Try following a template with a sample of a resume with the same layout so people can use the sample as a reference to make his/her own resume with the template!

**Question 7: Would you prefer to use a template to create your resume or the Resume Builder tool?  
Why?**

**Responses**

I prefer the template because it give me more freedom to change the resume to suit my needs. I think the Resume Builder is most ideal for people who have never written a resume and really aren't sure where to start.

If I had to use one or the other, I would choose template. It's easier to do since you can play around with it. ### **Question 8: Do you have any additional comments or suggestions?**

#### **Responses**

If you are cutting the Resume Builder because of lack of funds, I suggest that you try to bring it back in the future when or if your situation changes. I also think that while it is a nice idea to have a resume builder-style template on youth.gc.ca, it would really make more sense if it was included on the Jobbank website. I think people would be more likely to look for something like that there.

The resume style's are all fairly boring and typical. I don't think that resume's should be colourful or anything, but I think there should be more options to chose from. I like sans-serif fonts for resumé's for example, because I think this type of font stands out better. I don't think there are too many things to fill out as was suggested, but it looks that way when you first log on.

The site should try promoting itself through different jobsearch engines so more people can benefit from this amazing site. Also, by putting up posters in universities or high schools will help students starting up their first resume.

1. If a template is offered, it'd be nice to have a functional resume version as well. Most high school students simply have little (if any) to write about in terms of work experience, and a functional resume would meet most of their needs much better.
2. The Resume Builder tool seems to have some flaws in it. For example, I did a test resume, and the dates for work experience came out as ' September, 2001'. I don't know why the commas are there... the volunteer work date format is okay: September / 2000
3. You may wish to note that template (or resume-writing tool) users customize their resume by editing the formatting so that it doesn't look like it came straight out of a template. I always tell people to try to make sure that their resume is unique, and avoid using a template (esp. MS Word resume wizard), since you always are looking for little things that help make you stand out (though it's definitely fine to look at one, and even practise with one to get an idea of what a resume looks like). Having a resume that looks like everyone else's makes you simply yet another applicant. There's nothing that I find as funny/frustrating as when I'm asked to look over an resume which is obviously done with MS Word resume wizard. They all just look the same! Yes, it looks nice, but after looking over them on a regular basis, I start to wonder if these people either didn't know how to write a resume, or simply didn't want to put the effort into it. I think some employers would feel the same way, and that could prove to be the difference between getting hired, or not.

I think to have some sample resumes for every profession would be really useful.
