UNION MEMBERSHIP IN CANADA-JANUARY 1, 2005

Each year, the Workplace Information Directorate carries out a survey on labour organizations in Canada with national and international unions either affiliated or unaffiliated to a central labour congress and having one or more members, and labour organizations consisting of a single bargaining unit and having more than 50 members, but non affiliated with any other labour organizations.

Information obtained during the most recent survey indicated that on January 1, 2005, 4,381,000 workers were union members. This represents an increase of 120,000 members compared to the 4,261,000 members (2.8 per cent) accounted for on January 1, 2004. During 2005, the number of non-agricultural paid workers reached 14,269,000; an increase of 234,000 workers (1.7 per cent) over 2004.

Consequently, the unionization rate (union membership as a percentage of non-agricultural paid employment) was 30.7 per cent as of January 1, 2005, an increase of 0.3 per cent compared to the previous year.

The affiliated membership of the Canadian Labour Congress increased by 33,730 (1.1 per cent) from 3,121,010 on January 1, 2004 to 3,154,740 on January 1, 2005. Notwithstanding this increase in its number of members, the percentage of total union membership went from 73.2 per cent in 2004 to 72.0 per cent in 2005.

Information as of January 1, 2005, indicates that the percentage of membership from unaffiliated national unions reached 11.4 per cent, an increase of 9,090 members compared to the previous year.


