CHAPTER H-5

HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT

COVERING OF LOADS REGULATIONS

Pursuant to section 299 of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5, Council made the following regulations:

1. In these regulations

Definitions

(a) “waste” means waste ordinarily accepted for garbage disposal by a municipality and includes ashes, garbage, tree limbs, leaves, refuse and domestic waste;

(b) “designated area” means the area within the boundaries of the following municipalities and communities:

2. (1) Subject to subsection (2), where a motor vehicle, with or without a trailer attached, is carrying within the designated area a load that is waste, that portion of the load that is not enclosed by the vehicle or load container shall be covered by a covering that is made of tarpaulin, canvas, netting or other material in such manner as to confine the load within the vehicle or load container.

Load covering

(2) Subsection (1) does not apply where the motor vehicle is being operated

Exceptions

- (a) in the course of collecting waste; or
- (b) within the limits of a highway construction contract.

(3) Any person who operates a motor vehicle on a highway in contravention of subsection (1) is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less than fifty dollars. (EC1029/81)
