Together, these nations are developing a strong partnership with the people of Afghanistan so that, one day, they can stand on their own and protect their nation.

Under UN mandate, the NATO-led International Security
Assistance Force is rebuilding the capability of the Afghan police,
Afghan National Army and other institutions.
