## **ABBOTSFORD HIGHLIGHTS**

### Vacancy rates drop 45%

- ❖ The overall vacancy rate declined from 6.7% in October 1999 to 3.7% in October 2000. The largest decrease in vacancies occurred with one bedroom units, dropping from 7.2% to 2.9%, while two bedroom unit vacancies declined from 6.5% to 4.5%.
- The decline in vacancy rates is attributable to low consumer confidence in the housing market. More and more households are choosing to rent rather than buy, and those aready in the rental market are renting longer. Many in this group are 'would-be' first time buyers, the first link in the housing market, who are now opting to rent rather than purchase a home because of higher mortgage rates.
- While sharp reductions in vacancy rates are being seen, rental rates have stayed stable, with only marginal increases year over year. The average apartment rental rate is now \$571, up slightly from \$565 12 months ago. It is possible, however, that sustained declines in vacancy rates could provide upward pressure on rental rates.
