



Rental Market
Sudbury Vacancy Rate Falls
For Fourth Straight Year

After peaking in 1999 at 11.1 per cent, Greater Sudbury's vacancy rate for structures with at least three units has now fallen four straight years, according to CMHC's Rental Market Survey. Sudbury's 2003 vacancy rate is now pegged at 3.6 per cent.

The presence of College Boreal, Cambrian College and Laurentian University combined with this year's double cohort of students has meant greater demand for off-campus housing this fall. This effect plus decreased outmigration and more jobs in retail and call centres have helped the rental market.

Vacancy rates fell in all four geographic districts in the city with Zone 1 - Lockerby continuing to have the lowest vacancy rate in the Greater Sudbury. Lockerby's vacancy rate of 1.6 per cent is only 0.2 per cent lower than Zone 2 – New Sudbury.

Vacancy rates by bedroom type also fell across the board. Two bedroom units measuring 56 per cent of total units had their vacancy rate fall to 2.4 per cent from 4.1 per cent last year. For all other bedroom types vacancy rates fell with bachelor rates coming down to 9.6 per cent from 12.5 per cent. One bedroom rates and three bedroom rates in Greater Sudbury dropped to 4.6 and 2.1 per cent respectively.

Rents moved up again in 2003, but not as strongly as last year. Average two bedroom rents are now pegged at \$651, up from \$647 last year. One bedroom rents, jumped 2.1 per cent to \$524 from \$513.

Besides Greater Sudbury, CMHC surveyed eight other centres in Northern Ontario including North Bay, Sault Ste. Marie, Timmins, Thunder Bay, Haileybury, Kapuskasing, Elliot Lake and Kenora. CMHC's survey is done each October and covers all centres in Canada with at least 10,000 people.
