Apartment Vacancies Stable In Yorkton While Rents Increase

According to the results of the CMHC's annual Rental Market Survey, the overall apartment vacancy rate in Yorkton remained virtually unchanged from last year at just under five per cent.

Overall, there was a 0.2 percentage point drop in the apartment vacancy rate this year from that observed in 2001. Notable increases occurred in the bachelor and three-bedroom+ unit types while vacancies fell in two-bedroom units.

The slight drop in the overall vacancy rate is attributed to a rise in the overall universe rather than a decline in the number of vacant units. The total number of vacant units remained the same at 43 units. However, this year's apartment universe increased by 40 units from 839 units in 2001. Most of these new apartments were two-bedroom units, increasing the total stock of this type to 44 per cent of the total number of apartment units for rent.

Average rents continued to rise in the past 12 months, although the rate of increase has slowed from last year. Apartment rents increased, on average, by \$7 - which was less than half of the typical \$15 increase in overall average rent last year.

Rent increases were strongest in the one- and three-bedroom+ categories, with both types up by 1.5 per cent. Two-bedroom units experienced the smallest increases, up by only 0.6 per cent or three dollars per month, on average.
