### Vacancies on the Rise in Larger Centres


Results of CMHC's 2004 Rental Market Survey indicate that the vacancy rate increased in the three larger urban centres of New Brunswick, and declined in all the smaller northern urban centres, except Edmundston.


According to the 2004 survey, vacant units increased significantly in the Greater Moncton and Fredericton areas. In Moncton, the vacancy rate reached 5 per cent in October, the highest level since 1998. In the Capital region, the vacancy rate reached 3.7 per cent, its highest level since 1997. A significant increase in the number of new rental units coming onto the market over the past 12 months is viewed as the key factor which caused a rise in vacancies in these two regions. The lure of home ownership under historically low mortgage rates also appears to have been the catalyst in explaining this upward vacancy trend. In Saint John, rental market conditions have not changed significantly since October 2003, as indicated by a slight 0.6 per cent increase the vacancy rate (from 5.2 to 5.8 per cent).


A different story describes the current rental market conditions in Northern New Brunswick. The construction of new rental projects has been weak over the past twelve months in all the northern urban centres. A lack of new projects combined with relatively stable demand has caused a significant drop in vacancies in Bathurst, Campbellton and Miramichi City. Despite a drop of more than 3 percentage points, Bathurst still has the highest vacancy rate amongst the province's urban centres.

The CMHC Rental Market Survey is conducted every October in urban centres of 10,000+ population.
