### *Foreign Government Awards*

This program enables Canadian students of high academic standing to undertake postgraduate studies or post-doctoral research in foreign institutions.

Awards are offered for research or studies in arts, social sciences and humanities, natural sciences and engineering. Proposed programs of study or research must focus on a foreign subject or a field in which the country where you will be studying has internationally recognized expertise. Awards are normally for a maximum of one academic year.

Countries where tenable: Colombia, Finland, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Mexico, the Netherlands and Spain.

- round-trip airfare;
- tuition fees;
- a living allowance; and
- set-up costs.

## *Organization of American States (OAS) Regular Training Program (PRA) Fellowships*

The Organization of American States (OAS) offers fellowships to citizens or permanent residents of Canada to pursue postgraduate studies or research in OAS member countries in any field, except medicine and introductory language studies. Priority is given to research and study in Latin America and the Caribbean. The OAS has also identified the following priority areas: democracy, human rights, trade and environment. Fellowships are granted for periods of at least three months, to a maximum of two years.

### **THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF FELLOWSHIP:**

- advanced study at the postgraduate level (to pursue a study program in a university in the host country); and
- research.

### **FELLOWSHIPS INCLUDE:**

- round-trip airfare;
- tuition fees at the university in the host country;
- cost of study materials;
- life and medical insurance; and
- a monthly living allowance.

### **PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES:**

Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Grenada, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, United States, Uruguay, and Venezuela.
