Suggested activities to celebrate International Women's Day/Week 2000

Following is a list of suggestions to help you organize an activity to highlight International Women's Day/Week.

In order to ensure the success of your event, make sure to choose an event that suits your audience's interests and concerns.

YOU COULD ORGANIZE:

- A discussion relating to the theme for *International Women's Day/Week* or to the concerns of the women in your community, your co-workers, students at your school. The topics could include:
 - ♀ poverty
 - ♀ violence against women
 - ♀ self esteem
 - ♀ portrayal of women in the media
 - ♀ stereotyping and socio-sexual roles
 - ♀ equal rights
 - vomen's struggles
 - ♀ challenges of work and family
 - ♀ education and training for women
 - ♀ career choices
 - ♀ women and science
 - ♀ women in non-traditional roles

- employment and pay equity
- Sharing power and decision-making
- ♀ strategies to introduce change
- ♀ legal questions
- ♀ feminism
- ♀ gender relations
- ♀ women's health issues
- or issues of particular interest to Aboriginal women, lesbians, senior women, women with disabilities, immigrant women, or women members of visible minority groups
- A conference or round table with guest speakers to discuss issues relating to the status of women. Members of the panel could be affiliated with an organization fighting for women's rights.
- A brunch, a newsmaker lunch or a community dinner with your colleagues, neighbours or friends, on general issues of interest to women (see above list).
- ² An information fair with kiosks to distribute pamphlets and other material such as the material prepared by Status of Women Canada (SWC) for *International Women's Day/Week*.
- ² A photo or art exhibit in your work or school cafeteria, the public library, etc., featuring works created by women. Invite women's organizations to attend the activity.
- $\ensuremath{\,\cong\,}$ A quiz or contest on the history of the struggle for women's rights in Canada.
- ♀ A show, concert or play relating to the theme for *International Women's Day/Week* and donate the profits to a local organization working for women in your community.

YOU COULD ALSO:

- Highlight the special leadership qualities, contributions, achievements, progress or volunteer work of coworkers or members of your community working for women's equality (give a prize, write an article about them, or invite them to speak about their activities).
- ² Interview women in your organization or your community who work in a non-traditional job or who have key responsibilities.
- [♀] Invite women from several generations to share their personal experiences.
- Present a film or video on issues relating to women (see list of suggested films on the following pages) followed by a discussion. It may be helpful to have the discussion moderated by a special resource person. You could also invite a guest speaker to make a presentation followed by a question and answer period.
- ² Produce a promotional poster on *International Women's Day/Week* and post it on bulletin boards or on the walls in your office or school.
- [♀] Prepare and send out an e-mail message or bulletin in your organization.
- ♀ Write an article on *International Women's Day/Week* for your organization's newsletter or in a special publication dedicated to women.
- [♀] Write an Op-Ed piece and submit it for publication in your local newspaper or school paper.
- ² In your classroom, ask students to do search for information on the contributions of women's work in Canadian society. Turn it into a composition, a poem, a book report, a speech or research paper.
- Run a contest for photos, drawings, sculptures or other art on the theme "Canadian Women Taking Action to Make a Difference!".
- ² Copy the information sheets produced by SWC for *International Women's Day/Week* and distribute them <u>free of charge</u> to as many people as possible.
- ² Visit the "Calendar of Events" sections on SWC's Web site to find out what activities are happening across the country to celebrate *International Women's Day/Week*.

The dreams and realities of women have no limits! Use your imagination to celebrate *International Women's Day/Week* 2000!
