

Crime Prevention Community Mobilization Program

Request for Letters of Intent for Project Funding

The Prince Edward Island Joint Management Committee, on behalf of the National Crime Prevention Centre and the Office of the Attorney General, is accepting Letters of Intent for project funding under the Community Mobilization Program.

This funding is for projects to take place after April 1, 2001. Projects should not be more than one year in length.

Funding is available to assist communities or organizations, through partnerships, to undertake projects aimed at preventing or reducing crime and victimization. Key target groups include children, women, seniors and Aboriginal people. Emphasis is on community mobilization and addressing root causes of crime. Activities may include planning, needs assessments, developing resources, promoting inter-agency efforts and other activities.

A Letter of Intent should include the following:

- 1- Problem to be addressed:** A brief description of the problem or challenge you are trying to resolve.
- 2- Project idea:** What are the objectives of your crime prevention project? What are you planning to do?
- 3- Sponsor information:** Information about the group/organization which intends to sponsor the *project*. How does this activity fit within the mandate?
- 4- Description of Partnerships:** Who are the project partners? Describe their expected contributions (financial and in kind) to the project?
- 5- Community Mobilization:** Describe how the sponsoring organization intends to engage the members of the community in the activities of the project.
- 6- Funding request:** What is the "ballpark" projected amount you will be requesting from the Community Mobilization Program?
