#### ALBERTA'S ACTION PLANS under the CANADA-ALBERTA AGREEMENT ON PROVINCIAL AND INTERPROVINCIAL/TERRITORIAL COMPLEMENTARY PROJECTS RELATED TO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES IN EDUCATION 2005/2006

As outlined in Clause 6.3 of the *Protocol for Agreements for Minority-Language Education and Second-Language Instruction 2005-2006 to 2008-2009*, Alberta developed a proposal to access complementary funding in addition to the funding under the *Canada-Alberta Agreement on Minority-Language Education and Second Official-Language Instruction 2005-06 to 2008-09*. These activities complement and do not duplicate activities described in the other plans.

This funding will enhance current initiatives and enable Alberta to meet the following goals in minority-language education and second language instruction:

- Increase the proportion of eligible students enrolled in Francophone schools.
- Provide quality education that is comparable to that of the majority.
- Increase the proportion of secondary school graduates with a working knowledge of French.
- Increase access to post-secondary programs.

#### Provincial initiatives

These contributions will support complementary initiatives to address the following areas:

- development and implementation of adapted teaching resources for minority language education and second-language instruction (K to 12);
- improvement of access minority language education and second-language instruction at the postsecondary level;
- teacher and education support services in minority language education and second-language instruction at the postsecondary level;
- promotion of research in minority language education and second-language instruction (K to postsecondary);

- program growth and quality and cultural enrichment in minority language education (K to 12); and
- growth and improvement of French second language programs (K to 12).

### Interregional initiatives

Alberta is pleased to work with other provincial departments of education on collaborative initiatives such as the development of anthologies through the Western and Northern Canadian Protocol (WNCP) and the development and sharing of digital resources for K-12 subject areas through Memorandums of understandings with British Columbia and New Brunswick.

Alberta is also pursuing a joint project with la *Fédération nationale des conseils scolaires francophones (FNCSF)* on a national strategy to address the lack of teachers in the French language minority in Canada.

Alberta will lead the research and development of interprovincial/territorial initiatives in the following areas:

- development and implementation of adapted teaching resources for second-language instruction (K to 12);
- program growth and quality and cultural enrichment in minority language education (K to 12);
- promotion of research in minority language education (K to 12);
- improvement of access to minority language education at the postsecondary level; and
- teacher and education support services in minority language education at the postsecondary level.

Alberta continues to invest in multimedia and technology to increase opportunities for students to access post-secondary programs via distance delivery. For example, the Campus Saint-Jean is developing M.Ed. Courses via WEB for students in the Yukon, British Columbia and Saskatchewan.

Alberta is also pleased to support a multi-province campaign to promote the need for secondary-level teachers in mathematics, sciences and French in francophone and immersion schools.

Alberta (through Campus Saint Jean) is also involved in a number of research activities through *Bureau de Recherche* and the expanded *Centre d'enseignement et de recherche en francais*/Centre for Education and Research in French (CERF). Activities including multi-disciplinary research studies and an annual conference will allow opportunity for dialogue and partnership across the country.
