OFFICIAL LANGUAGES IN EDUCATION BRITISH COLUMBIA ACTION PLAN

BILATERAL AGREEMENT 2005-2006 to 2008-2009

PREAMBLE

BRITISH COLUMBIA'S GENERAL APPROACH, OBJECTIVES AND PRIORITIES

The Ministry of Education's strategic direction focuses on literacy, health promoting schools and school community connections. BC has a leading role for improving literacy both at the provincial and national levels. The Ministry promotes students' achievement, health and well being, parents' involvement, an environment of choice and flexibility and an environment that supports quality teaching and quality learning in schools.

The provincial objectives match the areas identified by the federal plan for minority language education: improving student recruitment and retention, increasing the number of qualified teachers and improving access to post-secondary education. They also match the areas in the federal plan for second language: improving Core French, increasing the number of qualified teachers and providing opportunities for students to use their language skills.

British Columbia is experiencing rapid growth among both minority language and French immersion student populations. The programs are vibrant and have shown a steady increase in enrollment for more than six years. The demand for French Immersion classes and programs has surpassed the ability of school districts to offer additional seats, even with the support provided by Official Languages in Education Program funds. The province does not need to "revitalize" French Immersion; through the Action Plan, British Columbia's general approach is to continue fostering the growth of these programs.

The priorities are:

- improve student recruitment and retention for the Conseil scolaire francophone de la Colombie-Britannique (CSF);
- improve access to programs, services and resources for francophone students in preschool and K-12 system;
- support of French Immersion growth in all school districts;
- increase student retention numbers at the secondary level in French Immersion;
- enhance and expand Core French offerings;
- expand programs and services for French speaking students in graduation programs and post-secondary studies;
- expand bursary programs for students in teaching programs and teachers in minority language education and second-language instruction.

CONSULTATIONSUNDERTAKEN

The Ministry consults with its educational partners on a regular basis using both formal and informal structures. Under different formats (e.g. meetings, conferences, workshops..) staff from the Ministry meet regularly with teachers, parents, trustees, superintendents, principals, vice-principals and organizations to discuss important education issues.

Minority language:

A series of formal and informal meetings have been held with the CSF (SD 93). In addition, teleconferences, informal and formal meetings have been held with a coalition comprising representatives of SD 93, Simon Fraser University, Collège Éducacentre College, and the *Fédération des parents francophones de la Colombie-Britannique* (FPFCB) and the BC-Yukon Chapter of Canadian Parents for French (CPF). The most recent meeting with representatives of the coalition was held in January 2005. The minority language section of this action plan was discussed and agreed to at the meeting. Specific proposals from each organization were updated in the fall of 2005.

Second Language:

A series of formal and informal meetings have been held or attended with representatives of the BC School Superintendents Association (BCSSA), modern language coordinators from various school districts, Simon Fraser University and the University of British Columbia, the BC Teachers Federation and two of its Provincial Specialist Associations (PSA), and the CPF. The most recent meetings were February and March 2005. The second language section of this action plan was discussed and agreed to at a February teleconference with representatives of BCSSA, CPF and the presidents of the two PSAs. Specific proposals from each organization were updated in the fall of 2005.

COMPLEMENTARY NATURE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS AND OTHER MEASURES BEING TAKEN

British Columbia will coordinate the measures identified in its action plans under regular and additional funding to maximize the effectiveness of each measure. The measures and the funding specified in the regular and additional strategies are non-duplicative in nature; they connect and build on activities across strategies to get the best value with resources available. The strategies identified in this agreement under regular and additional funding are distinct from any other federal/provincial agreements currently in place.

British Columbia's current general approach is working. However, there is a need to support the steadily increasing demand for these programs of choice. The additional funds will focus on:

- expanding on what is working well (more programs, classes and increase students enrolment in both Francophone and French Immersion programs);
- building on past success (improving secondary transition rates in both Francophone and French Immersion programs);
- enhancing what has been neglected or overlooked (Core French new approaches, following up on the beginnings of intensive Core French and offering Core French in K-3)
- expanding and improving training opportunities for teachers in minority language and second language programs.

The additional funds will not only complement measures being taken through regular Official Languages in Education Program channels; they will also complement British Columbia's focus on student achievement, choice and flexibility.

HOW BRITISH COLUMBIA'S ACTION PLAN HELPS CANADA ACHIEVE THE GOALS OF ITS ACTION PLAN

British Columbia recognizes that Canada has set ambitious qualitative and quantitative pan-Canadian targets in official languages. British Columbia's Action Plan is focused on increasing the number of students in minority language schools, especially by promoting elementary-to-secondary transition and retention. It is realistic to expect SD 93 enrolment to approach 5000 students by 2009 and the number of Grade 12 graduates from SD 93 double to 200 students.

It is also reasonable to expect a significant increase in the number of BC students who have a working knowledge of French as a second language by 2009. British Columbia will continue its work to define provincial standards for a "working knowledge" in order to determine current numbers and future projections.

The province has developed and implemented different provincial measurement tools; a provincial satisfaction survey, exam and assessment results and grade-to-grade transition rates. These are excellent performance indicators that may form the basis for measuring Action Plan progress.

British Columbia will continue to support the minority-language education and second-language instruction by investing an amount equal to or greater than the contribution made by the federal government.

SUPPLEMENTARY COSTS

Additional costs are incurred by British Columbia in support of French Minority Language Education and French as a Second Language programs and instruction. Activities include development, translation and adaptation of curriculum documents; development and translation of learning resources, additional provincial assessments and exams, teacher resources, targeted research and special intervention documents. Additional support is targeted to school libraries, teacher in-service, learning assistance and a variety of cultural activities for the enrichment and understanding of French Canadian heritage.

The provincial contribution under the term of the agreement will be at least \$28.5M per year with an average of \$14.5M for minority-language education and \$14M for second-language instruction. The Province continues to increase its funding in education and we expect to have an increase in total provincial funding over the term of the agreement.

The delivery of educational programs also entails additional costs supported through the provincial funding allocation system in recognition of small class size, transportation, administration and geographical realities. For example, this results in per pupil funding to the CSF being higher than the average per pupil amount for other public schools in the province. The support British Columbia receives through Official Languages Agreements with the federal government assists in offsetting some of the additional costs identified by B.C. school districts.

MINORITY LANGUAGE EDUCATION:

In 1997, legislation was enacted to support section 23 of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*. Under the British Columbia *School Act*, students in the Francophone Education system are entitled to receive the same educational programs as English-speaking students.

The British Columbia Ministry of Education supports the CSF in its mission and vision. The CSF Board of Directors undertakes to participate actively in the development of francophone community life in British Columbia. The francophone school district has seven (7) Directors representing the educational and cultural needs of all eligible children in the province.

In the 2005-2006 school year, there were 3,632 students enrolled in 37 francophone schools serving 55 communities across the province, 2,930 in Grades K-7 and 702 in Grades 8-12.

Capital Plan:

Recognizing the right of francophones to manage their own schools, the Ministry of Education, Funding Department has been working closely with the CSF to identify the best configurations for new schools and classroom structures to meet the needs of students.

Federal/provincial agreement on capital expenditures, new school and community spaces constructions and/or renovations:

Additional provincial expenditures of \$23.19M for the purchase of schools have not been included in federal agreements.

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SECOND LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION:

French Immersion

An ambitious French program for non-francophone students, French Immersion is designed to produce functionally bilingual students by using French as the language of instruction. French Immersion programs parallel the regular English program in structure and content. French Immersion in BC has been growing steadily in the last five years at an average of 5% per year. There are today 6,000 more French Immersion students in BC's public schools than in 1999. There are 38,389 students enrolled in 269 schools offering French Immersion in 44 of BC 59 public school districts.

Programs:

The required percentage of time in French Language instruction is:

Curriculum and resources are provided by the Ministry of Education for Early French Immersion (K-12) and Late French Immersion (6-12) programs.

Core French

Core French is a subject designed to enable non-French speaking students to begin to understand and communicate in French, as well as to experience francophone culture. Core French as a course has been in the BC curriculum for over 30 years; however, the Language Education Policy, in place since September 1995, requires another language to be taught from grade 5 to grade 8. This policy ensures that for a minimum of four (4) years students will take a second language course. French is the language most frequently offered.

The number of students enrolled in Core French is 254,258; a total of 1,591 schools in 58 school districts offer this course.

POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

The first university level programs for Francophone and Francophile students have been established in British Columbia. In February 2004 the Government of Canada and the Province signed a four-year agreement on the development of postsecondary education in French at Simon Fraser University. Additional opportunities are accessible for students wanting to pursue postsecondary studies in French in British Columbia through French collegial programs with Collège Éducacentre College. These programs will enable BC students to have access to collegial or university postsecondary programs in French.

Note: All enrolment figures include public and independent schools and are based on the 2005/06 school year.
