IMPROVING THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS

The government is proposing changes to the EA process that will make it easier to navigate, result in faster decisions, save time and money, and protect the environment.

The chart below shows the complaints received about the current system and how the government is making it better.

Complaints About The Current System	How We're Making It Better
Lack of direction on the requirements and content of EAs	Clear, consistent standards and principles so that EAs are complete and correct
Lack of knowledge among proponents delays outcomes	Improve education and outreach to eliminate confusion and false starts
Costly for both proponents and opponents	 Save money by removing duplicative planning work and improving guidance to reduce delays
Takes too long to receive a decision on approvals	 Time savings through improved guidance, reduction in duplicative work and improved government approvals timelines
Duplicates planning requirements of other provincial planning processes	Consolidate activities such as consultation for multiple approvals processes
Many opportunities to appeal Minister's decisions on such things as bump-ups and elevation requests	 Reduce opportunities for appeals by delegating decisions on bump-ups and elevation requests
EA slows development of minor projects with little or no environmental impacts	Ensure appropriate types of projects are subject to EA

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
