Notice of Smog Advisory

Today, the Ontario Ministry of the Environment issued a *Smog Advisory* for tomorrow, July 31, 2006 for the following forecast regions:

Elgin	Sarnia-Lambton
Huron-Perth	Windsor-Essex-Chatham-Kent
London-Middlesex	

A Smog Advisory is issued when there is a high probability for elevated smog levels the next day.

Hot and sunny conditions with southwesterly winds are expected to result in high smog levels in southwestern Ontario during Monday.

Smog is a hazy mix of pollutants made up of ground-level ozone, fine particulate matter and other pollutants. During the summer months, more than half of Ontario's smog-causing pollution originates in the United States. In cooler months, domestic sources can be significant contributors to the formation of fine particulate matter.
