

Unless otherwise stated, the length referred to is total length. (See page 4.)

Size restrictions listed above apply to both Sport Fishing and Conservation licences.

Daily Catch and Possession Limits

Daily catch and possession limits will depend on the type of fishing licence you hold, the species and where they are caught and in some cases the size of fish.

The possession limit is the number you are allowed to have in your possession on hand, in cold storage, in transit, etc. Possession limits are the same as one day's catch limit except where The catch limit is the number of fish you are allowed to catch and keep in one day. otherwise specified.

Shore Meals - Fish caught that day and eaten are counted as part of your daily catch limit.

- Divs. 8 and 11 (Lake Ontario and St. Lawrence River): five (5) salmon and trout in one day,
 - Divs. 6, 7, 9, 10, 12, 12A & 29: five (5) salmon and trout combined, in one day. Divs. 6, 7 but not more than three (3) may be lake trout, brook trout, and splake combined. and 9, see General Area Exceptions for lake trout in tributaries to Lake Ontario.
 - Two (2) in one day with not more than one (1) lake trout.

The catch limit is the number of fish you are allowed to catch and keep in one day. The possession limit is the number you are allowed to have in your possession on hand, in cold storage, in transit, etc. Possession limits are the same as one day's catch limit except where otherwise speci-

General Notes

- Fishing is prohibited in all waters of Div. 6, including Kawartha
 Lakes and Dalrymple Lake in the City of Kawartha Lakes (formerly known
 as Victoria County) and Simcoe County, from Nov. 16 to the Friday before the
 last Saturday in April in any year. This restriction does not apply to
 Lake Scugog ice fishing in Jan. and Feb.; nor does it affect
 "Additional Fishing Opportunities" listed below.
- Lake Scugog: walleye and yellow perch seasons open Jan. 1 last day in Feb.
- Div. 10 includes Opinicon, Wolfe and Silver Lakes in the County of Frontenac and White, Brook, Clyde and Bartraw Lakes in the County of Renfrew.
- The waters of the Trent River from Percy Reach to Lock 9 are in Div. 7.
- The Talbot River and its tributaries and the Trent Canal system in Ramara Twp., Simcoe County and Brock Twp., Durham Region, are in Div. 6.

- The Niagara River downstream of Niagara Falls is in Div. 8.
- The waters of Millhaven Creek downstream of the first dam are in Div. 8.
- The waters of the Cataraqui River downstream of the dam in Kingston Mills are in Div. 11.

Bait Restrictions

 In Divs. 9, 10 & 29 there is a year-round ban on fishing with live or dead lake herring (cisco) as bait.

Licences for Provincial Border Waters

Ontario-Quebec Border: You may fish in Lake Timiskaming and throughout Div. 12 (Ottawa River) and in Div. 12A (Lake St. Francis) with either an Ontario Resident or a Quebec Resident fishing licence.



Guide to Eating Ontario Sport Fish

Fish can be an important part of a balanced diet. Fish are low in fat and offer an excellent source of high-quality protein and other essential nutrients. However, some fish caught from Ontario waters can contain high levels of contaminants. To protect those who eat sport fish, the Ontario government tests fish from lakes and rivers throughout the province for substances such as mercury, dioxins and furans, PCBs, mirex/photomirex and toxaphene. The results of these tests are made available every two years in the Guide to Eating Ontario Sport Fish. The Guide provides species and size-specific advice on fish consumption from more than 1,700 locations in Ontario.



The 2005-2006 Guide to Eating Ontario Sport Fish is available free of charge from the Ministry of the Environment or by accessing the ministry's Web site (www.ene.gov.on.ca/envision/guide/index.htm).
