More than 100 Ontario properties on the Canadian Register of Historic Places

In its first year of participation in the Historic Places Initiative, Ontario listed the first archaeological site to the Register, the Lawson Site in London, and listed the first heritage conservation district to the Register, the Collingwood Heritage Conservation District.



Located at historicplaces.ca, the Register is a searchable database of historic places nominated by federal, provincial, and territorial governments. Use the Register to research your own community's history; learn about other parts of Canada; and locate places to visit on vacation, including places participating in Doors Open Ontario, which runs this year from April to October. 

Making Statements of Significance in French possible

Since completion of Phase 1 of the Ontario Heritage Portal project, more than 20 municipalities have submitted nominations to the Canadian Register of Historic Places electronically. Work is currently underway to enable French translation and online French language nomination of all Ontario listings to the Register.
