THE REPEAL OF THE SUCCESSION
DUTY ACT

AMENDMENTS TO THE REGISTRY ACT
AND THE LAND TITLES ACT

The Succession Duty Repeal Act, 1979 (Bill 47) received Royal Assent on April 18, 1979. Apart from repealing The Succession Duty Act so as not to apply to deaths occurring after April 10th, 1979, the legislation re-enacted section 50 (9) of The Registry Act and section 140(2) of The Land Titles Act.

The re-enactment in the case of The Registry Act reads as follows:


"(9) - Subsections 4 to 7 do not apply where the deceased person died prior to the first day of January, 1950 or after the 10th day of April, 1979."

The re-enactment in the case of The Land Titles Act reads as follows:

"(2) - Subsections 1 and 1a do not apply where the death of the registered owner occurred prior to the first day of January, 1950 or after the 10th day of April, 1979."

Succession duty consents are still required and will continue to be issued, where appropriate, for estates where the death of the deceased occurred between January 1, 1950 and April 10, 1979.

The Succession Repeal Act, 1979 does not affect the requirement of a consent of the Minister of Revenue on the registration of an original will or a grant based on a will given by a court outside Ontario having jurisdiction in probate matters as set out in section 50(2) of The Registry Act.
