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## HEALTH CARE FACILITY OWNER FINED \$2,000 FOR VIOLATING THE SAFE DRINKING WATER ACT

**LINDSAY** — The owner of a health care facility has been fined \$2,000 after pleading guilty to a violation under the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA).

Barbara Trumpauskas-Brown owns The Brown Home for Special Care, located 15 Patrick Street in Kirkfield, Ontario. The facility provides in-patient care services.

As the owner, Trumpauskas-Brown is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the facility's drinking water system, which is governed by Ontario Regulation 170/03, under the SDWA. At that time, Regulation 170 required that water sampling and analysis be performed weekly and noted in a log book.

The Court heard that an inspection conducted by the Ministry of the Environment revealed that Trumpauskas-Brown did not test the facility's drinking water between January 30, 2005 and August 27, 2005. A total of 31 weekly samples were not collected and tested.

Following an investigation by the ministry's Investigations and Enforcement Branch, charges were laid.

Trumpsauskas-Brown pleaded guilty to failure to ensure that at least one distribution sample is taken every week, contrary to Section 140(3) of the SDWA, and was fined \$2,000, plus a victim fine surcharge. The Court took into account the guilty plea and the previous history of compliance in setting the fine.
