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## PROVIDING BETTER ACCESS TO COMMUNITY SERVICES

The McGuinty government is investing \$117.8 million to improve home care services, and of that total, \$13.1 million in new funding to community services – which include community support services, volunteer hospice services, palliative care consultation services, acquired brain injury and assistive living services in supportive housing – bringing the total funding to \$507.1 million in 2006/07. The following is a breakdown of the \$13.1 million in new funding by Local Health Integration Network:
