Eva Nichols

Eva Nichols of Hamilton Township served as chair of Northumberland Hills Hospital's board. Nichols was the principal of Clarke High School in Orono, the founder of the adult school (The Centre for Individual Studies), course director of York University's Faculty of Education, president of the Continuing Education School Board Administrators for Ontario, and president of the Ontario Co-operative Education Association. Nichols has also served as a board member for the Northumberland United Way, the Art Gallery of Northumberland, the Cobourg District Senior Services, the Police Services Committee for Hamilton Township, and the Canadian Federation of University Women (Northumberland Branch).

Novina Wong

Novina Wong is a long-time resident of Scarborough. She served as the first clerk of the newly amalgamated City of Toronto from 1997 until her retirement in 2001. Prior to that, she was the clerk of the former Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto and held various senior administrative and executive positions at the municipal level. She is currently a management consultant. Wong's expertise in governance and her extensive management experience in public service were put into full use in her community volunteer endeavours which have included the Scarborough Hospital Board of Directors, the Scarborough Chinese Outreach Committee, the Community Advisory Board of the Scarborough Mirror, and City Governance Task Force of the Toronto Board of Trade

Stephen Kylie

Stephen Kylie was past-chair of the St. Joseph's Care Group. He is a life-long resident of the City of Peterborough where he has practised law for 26 years. He is on the board of directors of three of Peterborough's electric corporations, an active Rotarian and chair of the Mayor's Centennial Celebrations Committee for the City of Peterborough. Kylie has also served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Catholic Health Association of Ontario, chair of the Kawartha Pine Ridge Lung Association, director of the Ontario Lung Association, chair of the 1998 Ontario Winter Games and Legacy Fund Committee, chair of Peterborough's Bid to Host the 2001 Canada Summer Games, and chair of Peterborough's Bid to Host an Olympic Youth Camp in cooperation with the City of Toronto's Olympic Bid. He is a recipient of the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal and many other awards of recognition.
