Personal Protective Equipment Update

The following is provided to supplement information provided through your materiel management staff regarding personal protective equipment (PPE). This update is on masks.

Regional Coordination

- Coordinators have been identified across the province to:
 - o Provide a regional depot for back-up supplies (outside GTA)
 - o Identify needs specific to the region
 - o Review and approve requests from hospitals in region
 - Coordinate distribution of scarce supplies according to identified need
 - Advise ministry as required
- Regional coordinators are:
 - o Central: Robert Cullen
 - North West: Derek Gascoigne
 - North East: Ken Gazdic
 - o GTA West: Frances Guglielmo
 - o South Central: Len Kaufman
 - o GTA East: John King
 - o East: Guy Lemay

 - o South West: Mike Rosser (lead for outside GTA)
- Survey circulated to GTA hospitals June 3 to identify:
 - o Status of fit testing
 - Preferred mask(s)
 - o Daily requirements

Response to survey poor, survey to be re-sent by June 9

Standardized weekly order form developed for future planning.

Mask Inventory

- April request by hospitals for consistent supply of masks (3M 8210) rescinded as a result of fit testing. Hospitals sourcing own supplies of optional masks until May 31 when requests made of ministry for additional supplies
- Current inventory of masks by type provided to GTA coordinators
- Regional coordinators outside GTA checking inventory for optional masks
- Preferred mask manufactured in England
- Current inventory of optional masks being priorized with assistance of coordinators to higher-risk areas
- 3M has agreed to centralize masks inventory to assist with management of scarce resource
- Other optional brands are being sought for fit testing and acquisition.

Other Distribution

- Ministry providing N95 masks to primary care physicians in Metro Toronto upon request*
- Ministry providing N95 masks to Public Health Units*
- Public Health Units in Durham, York and Peel providing N95 masks to primary care physicians upon request*
- Ministry providing N95 masks to Emergency Medical Services in province upon request*

Mask Fitting

- Required since 1993 for occupational health and safety compliance
- Recommendation of Centres for Disease Control in May, 2003 after reviewing Toronto situation
- Both quantitative and qualitative fit testing acceptable. Qualitative fit testing the norm as quicker and more "portable"
- Standards for fit testing developed by Canadian Standards Association (CSA)
