

# Alberta Population Report

December 21, 2006

Third Quarter, 2006

## POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth between October 1 of 2005 and 2006 remains the strongest among the provinces. As of October 1, 2006, Alberta's population is estimated to be 3,413,464. This represents a yearly increase of about 111,500 persons (or 3.38% growth) since October 1, 2005. British Columbia and Ontario had the next largest growth rates among the provinces at 1.23% and 0.92% respectively.

The following table provides the October 1 population estimates and growth rates for Canada and Alberta since 2002.

Population estimates for October 1, 2006 for all provinces and territories are presented in Table 2 below. Also shown is the growth rates of population between October 1, 2005 and 2006.

## MIGRATION

During the third quarter of 2006 (July 1 to September 30), Alberta continued to have the highest interprovincial migration gain in the country. According to Statistics Canada, Alberta had a net of 24,500 interprovincial migrants this quarter, more than doubled the estimates in the second quarter. The substantial increase in the number of in-migrants from other provinces, especially Ontario was the main reason that Alberta had a huge interprovincial migration gain in the third quarter (Please see note at the end of Table 3 on the next page.)

As shown in Table 3: Origin and Destination of Interprovincial Migrants, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the third quarter was Ontario, followed by British Columbia and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the three main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

## NATURAL INCREASE

Alberta experienced a natural increase (births minus deaths) of 6,400 people in the third quarter. The province had 11,500 births versus 5,100 deaths between July 1 and September 30, 2006.
