


# Sent in search of gold by the king of France, Jacques Cartier set foot in Québec in 1534 and discovered so much more:





every adventure exuberantly wild!



Visitors from any country except the United States must carry a valid passport. American citizens need only proof of citizenship such as a birth certificate and an identity card that includes a photo. Visas are required for visitors from certain countries. It is always advisable to check with the Canadian consulate or embassy before setting out for Québec.
