Since moving we have been asked many questions

about our new location and our plans for the future so the following is a brief synopsis of our move to our new facility to try and answer some of the most

frequently asked questions. We are currently open for our Preview Season until August 2nd.

Our Preview Season consists of 3 temporary shows.
Our entiredownstairs gallery is filled with the beautiful, hand-crafted Bayeaux
Tapestry, a 200 foot wide art piece telling the story of the events of the Battle of Hastings in 1066.

Our East end gallery upstairs is filled with the artwork of the new WinterWonderland carousel. This space provides an opportunity to learn more about the volunteer artists, painters and carvers that have put in so much time and energy to complete this uniquely Northern carousel. The other side of the gallery is a montage of photographs showing North Bay through the years.

Our temporary gallery is showing the travelling show "Sitting Pretty - The History of the Toilet". This humourous exhibit is on loan for the summer from the Guelph Museum.

These shows are all available until August 2nd when we will shut down for a transition period to bring in all the new, interactive exhibits that are planned for the future.

The plan we are working with for all the permanent exhibits is that everything that goes on display must fall within the following criteria: it must move, make noise, visitors have to be able to touch it or activate it in some way or it must be alive!! Sounds like a lot of fun.

Our Museum collections will all be stored at the old location on Main Street with the upper temporary gallery @discoverynorthbay constantly bringing in components from these collections or travelling shows to tell stories from the community and around the world.

We hope everyone will come by and take the opportunity to see the amazing developments that have taken place to save a historic building in the heart of our community. Summer Programs

Archaeological Fieldschool

July 4th - 8th, 2005

Discovery North Bay, under the direction of Dr. David Slattery, once again conducted an archaeological excavation at Clarion Resort Pinewood Park.

This location held promise of producing artifacts related to both the earliest Native occupation in the area, as well as indications of the activities of European explorers and fur traders who traveled along the LaVase portage on their way to the West.

Participants were involved in all aspects of archaeological work. Over the one week period, each person was able to perform the actual excavation of the site, learn the proper procedures for recording and drawing results, and played a significant role in the preliminary interpretation of what was found.

This year 8 students were on-site for the week to learn about the history of our region while taking part in a hands-on dig right in our own backyard. The La Vase portage is an important historical link in the transportation history of the region.

Dr. Slattery comments that this was another successful season with potential finds of several arrowheads and other artifacts from the lives of early inhabitants of the region. Furthur study of all the materials will take place this




coming fall.
