- 2. "Location! Location! Location" Timmins is accessible via HWY 11 or 101, has bus and rail freight and bus passenger service via Ontario Northland Transportation and its airport is a busy gateway to northern communities, Toronto and other major markets.
- 3. "A Well Educated Population" The City has 2 community colleges, 1 university campus, and a number of adult learning and continuing education centres.
- 4. 'Professionals Dedicated to Helping You' The TEDC is ready to assist you with site selection, consulting, identifying local sectoral expertise, business plans and market information.
- 5. "Ease of Access" Timmins is located on Highway 101. It is 3 hours away from Sudbury, 4 hours from North Bay and 8 hours from Toronto. The Timmins Municipal Airport is within a 15-minute drive of the downtown. Toronto and Montreal are each 1½ and Ottawa is 2 air hours away.
