The Sport Branch facilitates and guides quality opportunities in, and impacts of, sport and physical activity in British Columbia through the development of public policy, effective inter-governmental relations, contracts and performance measurement systems.

The Branch's two broad goals are to promote and support 1) sport and physical activity for all and 2) opportunity to achieve. The Branch works with sector partners and other governments (and ministries) to identify and address systemic issues and opportunities related to these two goals.

The Sport Branch funds the 2010 LegaciesNow Society to deliver programs and services to organizations, athletes, coaches, participants, volunteers and others involved in sport and physical activity. This independent Society was established to help ensure the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Games benefit sport, culture and literacy efforts throughout the province.

Goals of the Sport Branch include:

- Provide oversight for the sport development function of the 2010 LegaciesNow Society to ensure this government investment:
 - improves development and competition opportunities for young athletes and for high performance sport
 - contributes to broader health, economic and social public policy objectives.
- Develop and maintain partnerships with other Ministries, orders of government, stakeholders and the private sector in order to align priorities and bring new resources to BC's sport and physical activity sectors.
- Support the 2010 Vancouver Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games.
- Provide oversight for government investment in major sport event hosting.
- Ensure that accountability mechanisms such as contract deliverables, program standards and evaluation tools are current and result in desired effects.
- Through policy, strategies and alliances, contribute to the provincial target of reducing physical inactivity by 20% by 2010.
