The result is a set of recommendations for an integrated, more efficient system, balancing safety concerns, social impacts and economic interests, now known as the Modernization Strategy.

This modernized system will be better equipped to address emerging issues like rapidly changing building technology and rising construction costs. A more consistent, coordinated building safety system will create efficiencies, reduce delays and building project costs.

The building safety system is complex and dynamic and as a result, this strategy calls for careful and involved work. It is our expectation that this work will lead to a better, safer, more efficient and competitive construction sector in British Columbia.
