The purpose of the Education and Extension envelope of the SCEK Fund is to support projects that will:

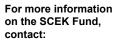
- Promote an understanding of the impacts and mitigation of oil and gas development on the land base
- Enhance the ability of industry, stakeholders and First Nations to communicate regarding activities, research findings and priorities associated with the Fund
- Promote extension of the findings of research associated with the Fund

The Fund gives consideration to proposals from interested First Nations, communities, organizations or individuals. The communication of project results and their application to industry regulations will be a priority.

The Education and Extension envelope of the Fund is one of five funding envelopes within the program. The other four envelopes are Health and Safety, Ecosystem and Cumulative Impact Management, Engineering and Technology, and Community Environmental Knowledge.

HOLOCENE-HUMAN HISTORY AND PALEOENVIRONMENTAL RECONSTRUCTION: 12,000/10,000 YEARS AGO TO THE PRESENT

PROJECT PURPOSE:

To excavate a previously recorded archaeological site and carbon date significant finds. This will provide information on both human and ecological trends over the past 12,000 years.

PROJECT SUMMARY:

What have been the human and environmental changes in Northeast BC over the past 12,000 years? This is the question posed by this study, which will provide a history of aboriginal occupation and environmental changes in Northeast BC since the end of the last glacial event. The study results will provide a standard basis for the future evaluation and interpretation of archaeological and paleo-ecological sites, and also inform present-day environmental and archaeological assessments.
