## **WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 9 JAN TO 15 JAN 2006**

### **MISCELLANEOUS**

On 15 Jan 06, heavy smoke was reported in the Chetwynd area as a result of a slash burn. Ministry of Transportation issued a severe smoke bulletin for the highway between Hasler Flats and Chetwynd.

#### **EVIDENCE SEARCH**

On 15 Jan 06, RCMP requested SAR assistance for an evidence search in the Enderby area.

#### FLOOD

On 9 Jan 06, Fraser Valley Regional District staff began monitoring water levels in the Chilliwack area after several weeks of continuous heavy rainfall.

#### LANDSLIDE

On 11 Jan 06, a mudslide occurred on private property, northeast of Nelson as a result of heavy wet snow that fell for two days. The resident was concerned that there would be more movement of the hillside which could potentially impact the mobile home on the property. Ministry of Environment staff along with the Emergency Program Coordinator responded to inspect the property and determined that the mobile home was not at risk and the homeowner was advised to contact a geotechnical engineer for advice on preventing future events.

On 11 Jan 06, two mudslides closed Hwy 31 south of Kaslo at Ainsworth Hot Springs for several hours. Regional District Area Director and the Ministry of Transportation (MoT) staff conducted a site inspection of homes above the highway and found no signs of flooding or structural damage to the residences. MoT Maintenance contractor will clear ditches and culverts of debris and mud.

On 12 Jan 06, the District of North Vancouver issued an evacuation alert to approximately 400 residences in the Berkley/Riverside area potentially impacting an estimated 1200 people. The alert was issued as a precautionary measure as a result of significant rainfall in recent weeks which might have caused slope instability. The District of North Vancouver conducted extensive geotechnical assessments of the area and has been working closely with the homeowners in the area. The province activated the Southwest Regional Emergency Operations Centre (PREOC) and the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) to level 1 to provide support and expertise to the local government.

On 13 Jan 06, Ministry of Transportation Geotechnical Engineers responded to assess the slope stability behind one residence in the Oasis subdivision near Trail. The residents voluntarily evacuated when it was determined the slope had moved approximately 6 inches due to heavy rain and snow and there was imminent risk to the residence. The Emergency Program Coordinator and Emergency Social Services Mobile Support Team responded to assist residents with short term relocation arrangements.
