### WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 03 April - 09 April, 2006

#### **FLOOD**

On 03 April 06, a resident on Juniper Street in Quesnel reported that slope slippage was threatening the residential and commercial buildings on his property. Ministry of Environment Water Stewardship staff conducted an assessment of the site and confirmed that soil slippage was occurring at the site and surrounding area. The Emergency Program Coordinator (EPC) was briefed and advised that the slope instability is all contained on private property. The owner had contacted the City of Quesnel last year to discuss protective works he wished to undertake. The local government is the jurisdiction responsible for approval of the work and assurance that it meets public safety standards.

On 03 April 06, a resident of Yahk reported that there was flooding on their property caused by a berm that had been constructed on a neighbouring property. Ministry of Environment staff members assessed the properties and confirmed that the berm was diverting water from flowing into the river which was causing the problem with property access at the residence.

#### BODY RECOVERY

On 04 April 06, Golden SAR was tasked to recover a body near the edge of the Trans Canada Highway by the Moberly Branch Road.

#### EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 04 April 06, Williams Lake and 100 Mile House SAR teams assisted RCMP to search for evidence at the Stampede Grounds in Williams Lake.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

On 06 April 06, Kent Harrison SAR responded to rescue a dog trapped in a slough. The dog was rescued and turned over to the SPCA.
