WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 26 June to 2 July 2006

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 29 Jun 06 Cranbrook SAR were asked to search the Joseph Creek area of Cranbrook for evidence pertaining to a missing male.

INTERFACE FIRES

On 28 Jun 06 a grass fire burning in the Quail Road area of Lake Country caused the residents of 15 houses to voluntarily evacuate while firefighters battled the blaze. Fire fighters suppressed the fire before it reached any buildings and the residents were able to reoccupy their homes.

On 01 July 06, a number of forest fires burning in close proximity to Tumbler Ridge threatened to cut off the only remaining route in and out of the community. The District of Tumbler Ridge activated their Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) and issued a Declaration of a State of Emergency. 3500 residents were ordered to evacuate. Emergency Social Services (ESS) established reception centres in Chetwynd and Dawson Creek to register and provide assistance to displaced residents. The Provincial Regional Emergency Operations Centre (PREOC) in Prince George and the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) in Victoria activated to provide support to local government and to assist with the coordination of provincial resources. The PREOC and PECC continue to work with the community of Tumbler Ridge, the Oil and Gas Commission, RCMP, Ministry of Forests (MOF), Office of the Fire Commissioner (OFC) and other stakeholders to ensure that resource needs are met and information is provided in a timely manner.

On 2 July 06, an MOF fire crew were fighting a fire 40 km north of Anahim Lake. An individual was found to be living in the area and due to the nature of the fire a tactical evacuation was required. The individual was brought to the fire crew camp until arrangements could be made the next morning in Anahim Lake.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 28 Jun 06, Mission SAR provided a safety escort for a community event known as Paddling and Poling Together. SAR members accompanied the paddlers so as to be ready in the event of a boat capsize or other complication.

On 30 Jun 06, Salmon Arm Highway Rescue responded with extrication tools to Shuswap Lake at Eagle Bay Rd where a boat reportedly crashed into the rocks trapping at least one person. The team was cancelled en route.

On 01 July 06, ESS established a reception center at the Campbell River Community Center to service over 200 passengers of an Alaska State ferry after an engine fire occurred on board temporarily disabling the vessel. Crew members assessed the fire

damage and decided to resume the vessels course north bound to Alaska. No ESS services were required for incident.

On 01 July 06, Golden Fire Rescue responded to assist BCAS in Golden. Fire Rescue members were cancelled en route as the patient was safely transported to hospital by BCAS.

On 03 July 06, Trail Fire Department evacuated 2 homes and a hotel when a construction crew ruptured a gas line at the intersection of Victoria and Pine in Trail. An EOC was established in Castlegar and a number of ESS volunteers and BCAS units were put on standby in the event that the evacuation area was expanded. Terasen Gas responded and the gas leak was shut in. All residents returned to their homes safely.

TRAIN DERAILMENT

On 29 Jun 06, a CN Train engine car derailed north of Pavilian in the Maran area near Lillooet. The engine car fell between 1200 and 1500 feet down the embankment and caught on fire. There were three crew members in the engine car and they either jumped or were thrown free of the car. One member was medically evacuated from the area by helicopter. The other two were declared deceased at the scene. Lillooet Rescue members assisted with locating the subjects and removing them from the area. There was little or no impact to the environment as the diesel that was on board was consumed by the fire. Ministry of Environment, Environment Canada, Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Canada and PEP monitored the rescue and recovery efforts.
