WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 27 Nov - 03 Dec

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On Nov 29, Kamloops SAR responded to assist RCMP with an evidence search near the intersection of Mackenzie and Yew roads.

FLOODING

On Nov 28, an ice jam at the confluence of the Coldwater and Nicola Rivers posed a potential threat of flooding in Merritt. Sandbags were deployed to protect some mobile homes located at the end of Garcia Street. The Emergency Program Coordinator and city crews continue to monitor the situation.

DEBRIS FLOW

On Dec 01, ice jams formed in the Bulkley River below the Quick Bridge. The Emergency Coordinator for the Bulkley Nechako Regional District and Ministry of Environment Water Hazard Specialist monitored the situation over the weekend.

SEVERE WINTER STORM

On Nov 26/27 a severe winter storm resulted in significant snowfall, high winds, wind chill warnings, road closures and widespread power outages that lasted several days throughout Vancouver Island, the Gulf Islands, the Lower Mainland and the Fraser Valley. Reception centres were opened by Emergency Social Services in Saltspring, Lake Cowichan, Sooke, Highlands, Juan De Fuca, Capital Regional District, Central Saanich, North/West Vancouver and Lions Bay. The Provincial Regional Emergency Operations Centers (PREOCs) in Victoria and Surrey and the Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) in Victoria were activated to provide support to local governments.

On 29 Nov, Saanich volunteers responded to canvass and determine potential needs of residents after the winter storm left many without power and heat. One stranded person requiring medical evacuation was located and ambulance responded to transport the individual to hospital for treatment.

MISCELLANEOUS

On Nov 27, residents in Mission were displaced when a tree came down on their property and the local Fire Chief deemed it unsafe for them to remain in their home. Emergency Social Services (ESS) responded and arranged one night's accommodation for the residents.

On Nov 27, Emergency Social Services responded to arrange alternate accommodations for a person who was displaced due to a police incident in New Westminster.
