WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 04 – 10 Dec 2006

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 05 Dec 2006, a collision between two semi trucks in the town of Taylor resulted in a fire and potential spill of thousands of litres condensate contained in the transport trailer unit. Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to urgent status (code 2) due to the volatility of the material involved and potential for explosion. The highway was closed to traffic and occupants of surrounding buildings were evacuated or advised to shelter in place while the incident was assessed by responders. The local Emergency Coordinator advised that the town's Emergency Operations Centre was activated at the community hall adjacent to the site and Emergency Social Services established a reception centre for those displaced. The MOE RO, representatives from the Oil and Gas Commission, Ministry of Transportation and Yellowhead Road and Bridge Maintenance Contractor responded and attended the site. The Office of the Fire Commissioner and PEP Regional Manager monitored the situation. The MOE RO and Fire Department remained on scene until the material was successfully offloaded and the road was reopened.
