While some parts of the province are thawing out from winter, spring is in full bloom in the capital.

FrontCounter BC Kamloops staff expect the spring and summer months to be their busiest yet as more people become familiar with the services they offer. FrontCounter BC Kamloops' business remained steady through the winter with an average of 400 inquiries a month, leading to about 80 projects a month.

The FrontCounter BC pilot project recently won major acclaim at the Premier's Innovation and Excellence Awards in Victoria, taking home top prize in the Cross Government Integration Category. Based on FrontCounter BC's tremendous success, it is now a provincial initiative with offices opening across B.C. This month we'll be opening offices in Prince George, Nanaimo and Surrey.

New Base Map Online Store Up and Running

The new Base Map Online Store is part of government's ongoing long-term plan to deliver services when and where needed. Base map products and services are now available to customers online 24 hours a day, seven days a week and many can be purchased over the Internet using a credit card.

The service replaces LandData BC and gives customers improved access to quality maps and images vital to their business.

The next phase of the Central and North Coast LRMPs is progressing smoothly. On March 27, the Minister of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation and I met with eight chiefs from the KNT First Nations in Alert Bay to celebrate the next phase of the historic agreement. We signed a land use protocol agreement that incorporates First Nations' culture, ecological and economic interests and allows the LRMP process to move forward.

Government signed a similar agreement with Turning Point First Nations finalizing the land use agreement for the North Coast just days earlier, on March 23. These government-to-government agreements include the formation of Land and Resource Forums that allow the Province and the First Nations to work together to finalize and implement land use plans for the Central Coast and North Coast.


