BRITISH COLUMBIA: THE LEADER IN RED TAPE REDUCTION

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As the Minister Responsible for Regulatory Reform, I want to underscore our government's commitment to reducing unnecessary barriers to growth and productivity for small businesses and taxpayers across British Columbia.

Under Premier Gordon Campbell's leadership, our commitment to regulatory reform is a key element in our strategy to make British Columbia an economic and business leader – and it's working. Our goal is clear. As British Columbians continue to work together to create the best job-per-capita economy in Canada, we will continue to lead the country in regulatory reform.

Since 2001, this government has reduced the regulatory burden on British Columbians by over one-third, eliminating 40 per cent, or 153,000 regulatory requirements, leading the way in Canada.

We've been successful in reducing regulations that frustrate entrepreneurship and reduce productivity – but there is more to be done.
