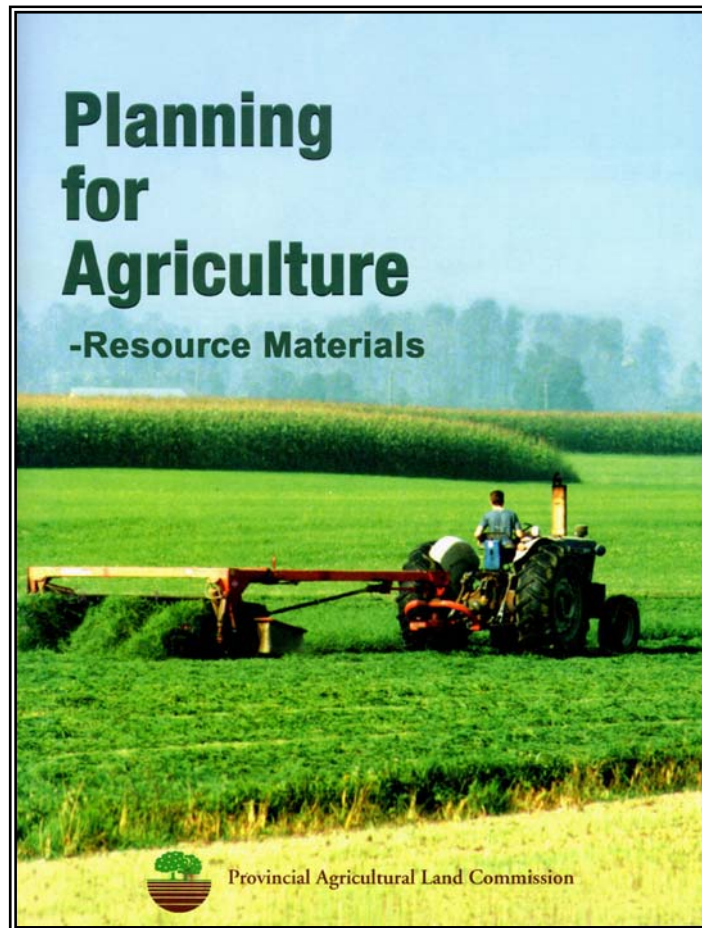




PLANNING FOR AGRICULTURE - Resource Materials -



Planning for Agriculture – Resource Materials (about 400 pages) contains a review of plan and bylaw delivery systems and how agriculture can best fit within these processes. Several key issues facing agriculture are considered along with practical suggestions and solutions that may be achieved through local initiatives. The importance of a more focused effort to plan for agriculture's sustainability through the adoption of 'agricultural area plans' and the detailed development of land use policy along critical portions of agriculture's interface are highlighted. *Planning for Agriculture – Resource Materials* was developed by the Provincial Agricultural Land Commission.
